Friday, October 3, 2014 • Depart

Our tour begins as we depart on our transatlantic flight to Berlin, Germany!

Saturday, October 4, 2014 • Berlin

Upon our early morning arrival in Berlin, we meet our tour leader and coach driver. We begin with a tour of Berlin highlighting the three centers of Berlin: the west around Kurfürstendamm Blvd and Memorial Church, the new center around Potsdamer



Square, and the east around **Unter den Linden**, **Brandenburg Gate and Alexanderplatz**. Tonight, we will have a **special welcome dinner**. **D**

Sunday, October 5, 2014 • Berlin, Wittenberg

After breakfast we visit the **Dietrich Bonhoeffer Museum**. Dietrich Bonhoeffer was a Berlin Pastor and Professor of Theology who resisted National Socialism during a time when tyranny and racism ruled Germany, victimizing religious, ethnic and social minorities. A guest speaker will share with us the history of Dietrich Bonhoeffer. In the afternoon, we have free time to enjoy this city on our own. Perhaps a visit to the **Pergamon Museum** with its' fabulous treasure or a visit the **KaDeWe**, the continent's largest department store would be your preference. This evening we drive to Wittenberg our home for the next two nights. **B/D**

Monday, October 6, 2014 • Wittenberg



We begin our sightseeing tour with a visit to the inspiring Schlosskirche (Castle Church), and the historic "Theses Doors." It was here in Wittenberg, where Martin Luther's 95 Theses were courageously given to this prominent university town and to the world. We visit the beautiful St. Mary's Church, where Luther preached and his children were baptized. We'll marvel at the amazing detail in the reformation theme altar painted by Lucas

Cranach. We also tour the Lutherhalle (Luther House Museum). In 1508, when Luther came to Wittenberg, he stayed here with the other Augustinian Monks. Later, Luther and his wife, Katharina von Bora, raised six children here. Now this is home to the largest collection of Reformation

artifacts in the world. We'll be able to view some of Luther's very own personal library, rare manuscripts, early Bibles and some of the very pamphlets that Luther had printed, stoking the fires of the Reformation! Tonight we will be joined by members of the English Ministry **in Wittenberg** for dinner and later meet some former East Germans and ask them about life Germany today and as it was before the wall came down. **B/D**

Tuesday, October 7, 2014 • Leipzig, Erfurt

This morning we drive to one of Europe's flourishing trade and commercial centers during the Middle Ages, and which became the center of resistance to Communist rule just over a decade ago. Here we have the privilege of visiting the **Nikolaikirche** (St. Nicholas Church), the home of the faithful "Pray for Peace" Christians, and the powerful force that transformed Germany's East and West. In 1989, thousands of East Germans gathered by candlelight in this church to form human rights and pro-democracy demonstrations, that led to the destruction of the infamous Berlin Wall and the dissolution of East Germany. Another Leipzig highlight will be our visit to **Thomaskirche** (St. Thomas Church), where Luther preached and Johann Sebastian Bach performed and directed the famous St. Thomas Boys choir. Then we continue on to Erfurt, our stay for the next two nights. **B/D**

Wednesday, October 8, 2014 • Eisenach, Erfurt

We begin this morning with a visit to Wartburg Castle, where



Luther found refuge and translated the New Testament into German. This afternoon a local guide takes us on a tour of Erfurt including the **Augustinian Monastery**, where Luther studied for the priesthood and **St.**

Mary's Cathedral, the site of Luther's ordination. B/D

Thursday, October 9, 2014 • Coburg, Rothenburg

This morning we head south to the lovely city of Coburg to visit the **famous Veste Coburg**, the fortress where Luther

took refuge and lived during the Augsburg Confession. Visitors to the castle nowadays will be able to see the Luther Room, the art treasures in the various collections and the royal building with the Luther Chapel. We'll end the day in Rothenburg, a well-preserved

medieval city, with ramparts, a city gate and town hall. Perhaps the most famous town on the "Romantic Road", Rothenburg is indeed a jewel. It is a nearly intact medieval walled-city without a single modern building within. We'll enjoy a meal at our hotel in this wonderful city, followed by the **Night Watchman's tour**. **B/D**

Friday, October 10, 2014 • Heidelberg

After breakfast, we drive to **Heidelberg** where the Heidelberg Confession was written I 1653. We start at the Heidelberg Castle where we see the Grosse Vat and hear the stories of the young prince. Then we ride tram down to the city center for a walking tour of the Old Town and the famous Stone Bridge over the Neckar River. We overnight in Heidelberg. We have some free time this afternoon to explore the Old Town on our own. We enjoy dinner tonight at a nearby winery. **B/D**

Saturday, October 11, 2014 • Mainz, Worms, Heidelberg

This morning we drive a short distance to **Mainz** to focus on Bible printing history & the contribution of Johann Gutenberg, who developed moveable type. We'll be amazed as we view original copies of the Bible in the **Gutenberg Museum**. We'll also view Mainz Cathedral, dating back to 975. Then we return to Worms. What a better way to spend our last afternoon on our last day following the footsteps of Luther. We see the site of the Worms Debates (Diet of Worms), now a park, with a plaque commemorating the Diet of **Worms and the Reformation Monument**. We hear the stories of Luther as he responded "Here I stand, I can do no less. God help me." We also learn of another Reformer, William Tyndale who finished his printing of the English Bible in Worms. Tonight we return to Heidelberg, for a celebration farewell dinner as our tour comes to an end. **B/D**

Our motor coach takes us to Frankfurt International airport for our return flight home. B

Currency:

Currency exchange rates fluctuate constantly. In the event of a significant drop in the value of the dollar, we reserve the right to add a currency surcharge to the price of the tour.

Refund/Cancellation Policy:

All cancellations must be in writing. The date of postmark will determine the amount of refund due. Refunds are based on the number of days prior to departure date. From the time of deposit to 99 days before departure a \$100 administrative fee plus any airfare penalties will be assessed. From 99-14 days, a \$300 cancellation penalty plus lost airfare deposits and any unrecoverable deposits to ground suppliers will be assessed. Airline tickets once purchased are nonrefundable.
